Dear Jran Community:

Today, we will be discussing plans for re-opening our doors, updates from the City and County, bulk purchasing of masks and hand sanitizer, and a free mask give away this weekend.

## **Planning for Re-entry**

This Thursday, the Federation will be hosting a “Conversation Starter” webinar on reopening our Jewish institutions. We will have Houston City Council Member Abbie Kamin give an update from the City; Taylor Landin, Senior Vice President of Public Policy for the Greater Houston Partnership, will go over their “[Work Safe 2.0: Principles to Guide Reopen Houston Safely](#),” and Dr. Ed Septimus, infectious disease expert at Memorial Hermann, will help walk us through some practical applications.

## **Updates from the City and County**

Mayor Turner and the County are reminding people that we continue to see new cases of COVID19 in our area. Between the [City of Houston and Harris County](#), we have 6,967 confirmed cases; 4,323 active cases; 140 deaths; and 2,504 recovered individuals. The Texas Medical Center is reporting a [flattening of our curve](#) as of today. While our hospital system is still [within its capacity](#), it does not mean now is the time to lift restrictions and go about life as usual. As one doctor put it, being within the hospital’s capacity just means they have a bed for you when you need it—not that the virus is gone.

There is a [lot of concern](#) about the Governor’s order to slowly re-open Texas, with experts disagreeing on how the Governor’s office is gathering its data and the low test rate for the state. Additionally, Texas doesn’t fit the [White House’s criteria for re-opening](#).

Mayor Turner is asking that the [public be mindful](#) and continue wearing masks, as the virus is still in our City and 25%-30% of people do not show symptoms and are still infectious.

### **Mask and Hand Sanitizer Co-op**

The Federation is currently looking into a bulk purchase of tri-fold non-medical masks, gloves, and hand sanitizer as we look forward to opening our doors possibly in the fall. Masks will be critical in protecting our community until a vaccine or therapy is developed to eliminate COVID19. Providing masks will be like providing kippot—we always need to have some on hand just in case someone forgets theirs at home.
