COVID-19 Emergency Appeal

The Jewish Federation of Greater Houston and the Houston Jewish Community Foundation have partnered to lead our community's response to the pandemic through a joint COVID-19 Emergency Appeal. To date, we have raised \$3.4 million to support the urgent and basic needs of individuals and families, sustain our community institutions, and ensure the continuity of Jewish life in Houston.
