Community Security Program Mission

The Joan and Stanford Alexander Family Community Security Program is here to secure the Houston Jewish community, in partnership with Secure Community Network (SCN). Since the program began in 2022, we closely collaborate with key partners in law enforcement, Jewish nonprofit organizations, local leaders, and SCN to protect our facilities and keep our community safe.

Secure Community Network (SCN)

SCN is the official safety and security organization for the Jewish community in North America. It is a team of intelligence, law enforcement, homeland security, and military professionals, recognized as the Jewish community's official liaison to federal law enforcement. Our Security Team collaborates with SCN to create a stronger shield of protection for our community and ensures that we can leverage a diverse range of expertise, share critical information across the SCN network, and coordinate effective responses to threats and attacks.

Al Tribble Regional Security Advisor

Tribble joined the Federation and SCN in 2022 after serving for more than 27 years as a special agent in the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). His work often focused on civil rights, human trafficking, and white-collar crime investigations. He is a subject matter

expert in color of law violations and hate crimes. He is the expert security advisor, liaison, and training coordinator for the community.



Cody SearsDeputy Regional Security Advisor

Sears joined the Federation and SCN in 2025 after a 16-year career with the Boulder County Sheriff's Office and he is a U.S. Marine Corps veteran. He worked as a SWAT team leader, detective, sergeant, and Town of Lyons

WHAT WE DO

Our security efforts are centered around five main pillars:



Monitoring & Acting on Threats

We build a protective shield over the community by partner with SCN to use cuttingedge technology to proactively monitor for, identify, and investigate threats.



Securing Facilities & Events

We offer facility assessments and event security plan recommendations to protect against threats, and guide organizations through the process to obtain government grants for security upgrades.



Security Training & Incident Reporting

We empower participants with hands-on training and life-saving skills to prevent, respond to, and recover from potential incidents. Our Incident Reporting Form offers a simple tool to report antisemitic incidents so we can coordinate a response.



Coordinating with Law Enforcement

We facilitate two-way intelligence sharing, coordinate on threat response protocols, and serve as a bridge between our community and public safety agencies.



Partnering Across the Community

We build partnerships with law-enforcement, Jewish organizations, the multi-faith community to ensure comprehensive protection and information sharing.
