
LOCAL IMPACT FUND | \$198,000

The Jewish Federation of Greater Houston has awarded \$198,000 in grants from the 2025 Local Impact Fund to support 16 programs that respond to the community priorities determined in the Hineni Houston listening journey. All local Jewish organizations were invited to apply for new or expanding programs that align with the fund's priorities.

The priority areas for funding are:

- **Inclusion:** Youth and adults with special needs, LGBTQIA+, Greater Houston neighborhoods outside the central core Jewish area, mixed heritage and Jews of color, and interfaith families.
- **Engagement:** Programming for Elementary Middle school age children and their families, adults across ages and stages (including seniors), and partnerships across religious denominations.
- **Education:** Combating antisemitism, fostering support for Israel, building bridges between the Jewish community and non-Jewish communities, and volunteer opportunities.
